



CARE FOR ELDERLY



Learning Outcome:

- Show appreciation, understanding and care for the people around them.
- Encourage positive interaction with elderly in the community.
- Use simple positive words or phrases to express feelings of gratitude and appreciation
- Imitate roles of family members during dramatic play to emphasis the importance of these relationships



Activity 1: Good Behaviour Chart



Learning Objective: Children will be able to reflect on positive behaviours.

Children will share their understanding about elderly. Discuss ways of portraying positive behaviours when we see the elderly. Children can work in pairs or groups to write down the things they know and examples of good manners on papers.

Activity 2: Neighbourhood Walk



Learning Objective: Children will be able to reflect and practise the good behaviours when meeting the elderly.

Children can take a walk in the neighbourhood. Remind the children on the good manners to demonstrate when greeting or talking to the elderly. Let the children demonstrate the good behaviours that they had discussed in the previous activity.

*** In view of the current situation, children may talk to their grandparents at home or senior neighbours instead.



Activity 3: Share & Discuss



Learning Objective: Children will learn and understand more about elderly and the good behaviours.

Once the children are back in school (after activity 2), children will have to draw their observations on papers and share their understanding about elderly. The children will discuss the things they learn from activity 2 and what they can do to keep the elderly around them safe and feel appreciated.

*** Teachers to help us to take some photos, upload to social medias and tag us. Children may also submit their drawings (hard copy) to us and we may display it in our upcoming events.
