Rainforests are green lungs of our Earth - they absorb carbon dioxide and produce life-giving oxygen. They are also homes to a dazzling variety of animals.

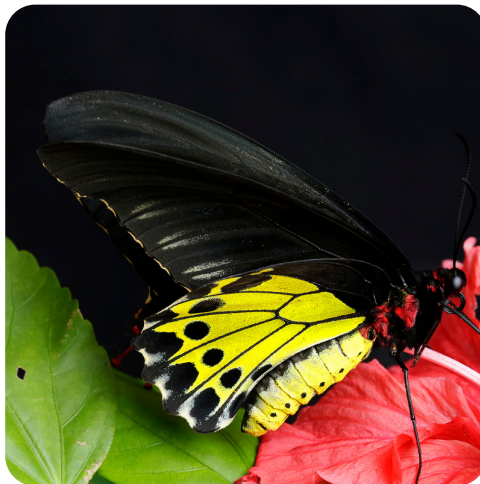
Around the world, rainforests and their inhabitants are threatened by illegal logging, the pulp and paper industry, and unsustainable agricultural practices.
