

I need your help hero! Go to all the 3 towns, carry out the activities and collect the petals.


With the petals "in" the bottle, say a pledge found at the end of the book and the spell will be broken!



To care for a person is to do things that make the person happy, healthy and safe.

First, you should take care of yourself and stay healthy! We can do this by keeping our bodies clean and having good toilet habits.

We can care for others by doing simple things like having clean personal habits — this helps prevent germs from

spreading to them.

Keeping My Hands Clean Here are some things a hero should know!



Why is it important to wash our hands?

- Our hands contain a lot of germs that can cause diseases and make us ill!
- Our hands are also covered with germs when we touch our toys or play with things around us. Everything contains germs!
- Washing our hands with soap helps ensure that these germs do not spread around to make you or people around you sick!

Be a Hand-washing Ambassadori Care for other people's health

What does a hand-washing ambassador do?

A hand-washing ambassador teaches others that washing hands is important.





Protect your family's health and help Care Town too!

- When you see someone at home washing their hands, explain to them that you are a hand-washing ambassador, praise them for being clean and give them a "I have clean hands" sticker!

- 4. Go through the "Let's Reflect" questions together at the end of a day or a few days.
- Reward your child with a care petal sticker (see centre spread sticker page).

Other Ways of Keeping Clean



Besides washing your hands, here are other ways to keep yourself clean and healthy. By practising these, we can care for ourselves and others too!

Let's Do H!

- Read the Keep clean action words on pages 10 and 11.
- 2 Stick the correct sticker into the box next to these action words.
- 3 Act out these Keep clean actions!

Keep your fingernails short and clean


This prevents germs and dirt from hiding under your nails.

Brush your teeth

This will keep your teeth clean and white; and your breath nice and fresh!

Don't cough or sneeze into the air

Cough or sneeze into a piece of tissue and throw this away. This helps to stop germs from spreading to others.





Duration of activity: 15 minutes

- 1. Read pages 10 and 11 together.
- 2. Get the stickers from the centre spread sticker page. Optional - get some props: toothbrushes, toothpaste, paper masks, tissue paper.
- After your child has done the matching, act out the keep clean actions together using the props!

Parent's Tip

Role-playing can be very useful when teaching children how to react in new or unfamiliar situations. Acting gives children a chance to learn the appropriate reactions in a fun way. Try it out!

Keeping the Toilet Clean

Another way to care for ourselves is to have good and clean toilet habits.

Pretend you are a toilet inspector! Look for these bad toilet habits in the toilets you visit. Which have you seen?

Look at the poor toilet habits on page 12. What should you and other people do to prevent them?




Duration of activity: over one day or a few days

- 1. Go through the photos of poor toilet habits on page 12.
- 2. Discuss the questions in the "Let's reflect!" section together:
- How to prevent smelly and unflushed toilets? Flush the toilet often or after each use.
- How to prevent toilets with rubbish on the ground? Throw all rubbish properly into the bins provided.
- How to prevent dirty or wet toilet seats?
 Clean the seat if you do wet it and do not stand on the toilet seat.

Super work in completing the 2nd treasure chest activity in Care Town! You get another care petal to paste on page 3! Now you can move on to the next town!

What is Litter?

Litter is anything which is not thrown into the proper place - a rubbish bin, or anything that is left behind when a person leaves.

What can litter do?



Litter can dirty a place and attract pests (unwanted, dirty animals which can spread diseases)



Sharp pieces of litter like broken glass or rusty nails can hurt us



Litter can collect rainwater and breed mosquitoes

- **3.** After the reading/acting out of the story, discuss the questions under the "Let's Reflect!" section:
- Who should clean up the rubbish that we make? We should not wait for cleaners to clean up after us. We should be responsible and clean up after ourselves.
- Why should we clean up the park after using it?

What are mosquitoes?

Mosquitoes are insects. We humans often consider them to be a pest because they suck our blood causing us to itch. However, only the female mosquitoes suck blood as they need the protein found in it to make eggs. Male mosquitoes feed on nectar and plant juices.

What is the life cycle of a mosquito like?

Females lay their eggs on stagnant water

Adult Mosquito



Eggs

It takes only

7 days

for an egg to become an adult mosquito!



Larva (Wriggler)







How does an Aedes mosquito spread dengue?

Not every female Aedes mosquito spreads dengue. Only one which has bitten a person with dengue spreads it. Since it carries the virus after biting, the next person it bites can get dengue.

- Use the internet to find out more about dengue, and its symptoms, and where the common mosquito breeding places are.

Parent's Tip

When teaching or talking to our children about potential dangerous animals like mosquitoes or even animals in the wild, we should talk objectively about the facts and convey a sense of alertness and carefulness. We should avoid over-reacting as this may instil imaginary fears in our children.



Mozza spotted a 💭 , with


bright coloured feathers and flew near it. "I'm sick," it shouted, "and I won't taste good!" "HAA-CH00000!"

sleeping in its den! She


thought to herself, "I'm sure this would be exciting!", and flew into the big fluffy mane. "Ahhh! I'm stuck and I can't see!"
