S.E.A. Aquarium, Resorts World Sentosa had provided us with the logistics to support our beach clean-up. Children were divided into small groups and each group was given a bag of tongs, disposable gloves, an activity card with clipboard, pencils and a garbage bag.







Before our fieldtrip to S.E.A.

This video showcase gave us the opportunity to promote public awareness on Marine Conservation too.















The set-up included the main marine animals that can be found in the Singapore waters – grey shark, sea star, corals, sea turtle, sea jellies and seahorse.







We displayed the rest of the 3D marine animals as well as the postcards on the walls.



We got some plastic waste and put them in the garbage bag to show children the common plastic waste that can be found at the beach. This created awareness of the hazards to the marine animals' habitat.











We also displayed the documentations on our fieldtrip to the S.E.A. Aquarium and the beach clean-up at the East Coast Park.







We displayed children's cards on what they see from the posters, what they think happened and what they wonder will happen to the ocean in future.






A station was set-up for parents and members of the public to write their personal pledges on what they want to do to save the marine animals' habitat. They pasted their pledges on the walls to inspire others.


Children completed their 'My Reflection Journal' after the classroom and outdoor activities. We had class discussions and shared one another's experiences throughout the learning journey.















Teacher's Reflection: Sudina Binte Surani

This project brought our teachers together to plan meaningful activities for our children to understand the importance of disposing litters properly, especially at the beach as well as to avoid single-use of plastic. The various activities involved children to learn the different marine animals found in the Singapore waters and come up with ideas on how we can work together to keep the ocean clean.
