


“Elle, here’s a mug with a toothbrush for your teeth...”

Tate asks, "Who are you? You look like the sponge!"






Water Wally replies, “Water works differently. Today, we will go on a journey that water goes through all the time. When the sun comes out, the sky absorbs water on the ground.”

Tate says, "So we are lucky. Whenever we turn on the tap, we have water. I should not be playing with water."




Elle nods her head. Water Wally smiles and says, "We must be thankful that we have water."




