The Think! Contemporary Programme first started as a **multi-visit, museum-based school programme** for Primary school students.

The programme advocates learning through art from SAM exhibitions and uses a multi-disciplinary approach to teach students analytical and creative thinking skills in addition to the school's syllabus. The Programme culminates in a yearly exhibition and has also expanded to include preschools since 2019.

Mar - Apr	Visit to The SAM Learning Gallery	Gallery session conducted by SAM's Education Specialist. Advance booking is required, subject to availability.	1 hour (excluding snack break)
Apr - 15 May	Creation of artworks	Teachers to talk about works to create in school relating to topics such as: nature, greening, conservation, caring for environment, heritage, inclusiveness etc.	Students can work on their master piece during curriculum time.
18 - 22 May 2020	Completion of Artworks	Prepare for Exhibition and Exhibition Opening in early June 2020.	2 hours
